To start things off, we wanted to introduce you to a new resource on our website: [The Redress Policy Toolbox!](#)

Every community has been impacted by segregation, but different types of communities require different solutions. Wealthy, majority-white suburbs with highly-rated school systems need different policies than majority-Black neighborhoods facing disinvestment. The toolbox utilizes a short Community Segregation Survey to help you understand what type of community you live in, and then proposes a menu of redress policies or programs to address each type of community's specific issues.

In Denver, The Redress Movement's Senior Campaign Organizer, Kevin Patterson, successfully organized around two legislative bills that were both recently signed into law!

HB24-1098 signs into law Just Cause renter protections - which requires landlords to have a clear reason to evict a tenant. This bill now adds a notch in the belt of local renter protections amidst surging evictions and a shortage of rental supplies, and is a **HUGE** win for renters in Colorado!



HB24-1267 also passed at the end of March and prevents Metropolitan Districts, which often operate in similar ways to HOAs, from foreclosing on homeowners. This victory goes a long way toward stopping abusive and exploitative foreclosure practices that disproportionately impact people of color.



## New action out of Charlotte!



Our new Senior Campaign Organizer in Charlotte, Greg Jarrell, has been hard at work gaining signatures and momentum on a new petition fighting for Equity and Affordability through Charlotte's housing trust fund.





We are asking the city of Charlotte to double funding for the Housing Trust Fund (HTF) through a \$100M bond. Doubling the HTF bond from 2020's \$50M will help to account for inflation, the rising cost of materials, rising interest rates, and other increased costs to build. Even more importantly, new HTF money will incentivize developers to build affordable housing in middle- and higher-income areas.

On March 6th, Milwaukee Senior Campaign Organizer Dynasty Ceasar turned out dozens of folks to the County Board of Supervisors' Health Equity, Human Needs & Strategic Planning Committee hearing, to support the creation of an official Housing Committee. Concerned residents, not politicians, will make up the majority of Committee members, which will be authorized to craft solutions we need in the affordable housing crisis

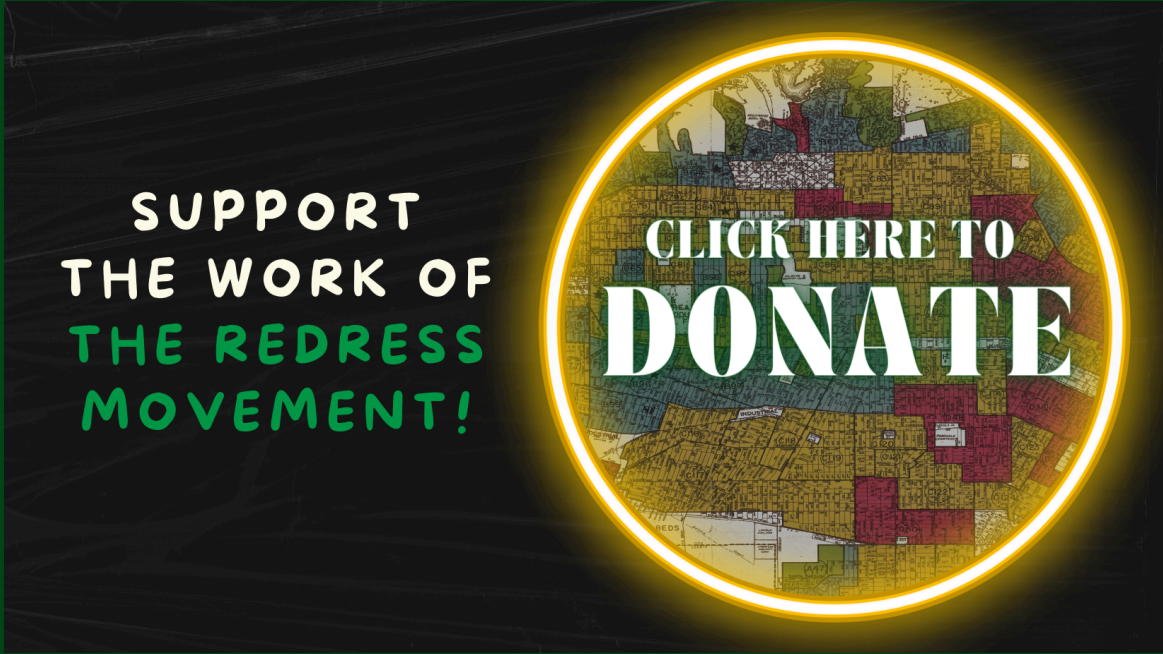
After the Health Equity voted unanimously to advance the resolution creating the Housing Committee, the resolution passed at the March 21st County Board meeting!
