Redress On The Move!



Redress' executive director, Cashauna Hill, recently moderated a panel titled: **"Addressing Food Insecurity and Housing Shortage"**

Hosted by the Global Black Economic Forum, the panel examined how food and housing instability have long disproportionately affected Black communities and historically marginalized groups.

Cashauna was joined by three experts advancing innovative solutions to tackle these systemic issues:

Claire Babineaux-Fontenot, Chief Executive Officer, Feeding America; Tawan Davis, Founder & CEO, the Steinbridge Group; and Adrienne Todman, Acting Secretary, US Department of Housing and Urban Development.

But that's not all...

The rising property insurance costs contribute to the national housing crisis for homeowners, renters, and entire communities. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development recently convened a first-of-its-kind [summit](#) to address the costs and its impact with leaders across sectors. The Redress Movement is working to drive solutions to alleviate the disproportionate burdens placed on Black and low-income communities. Cashaura contributed her expertise a session titled "The Future of the American Dream: How a Lack of Home Insurance Coverage Threatens Homeownership." The discussion, moderated by Vanessa Perry, Interim Dean at George Washington University School of Business, included insights from other prominent figures: Brian Powell, Catastrophe Risk Resilience Specialist at the National Association of Insurance Commissioners; Valerie Brown, Deputy Executive Director at United Policy Holders; Rob Howard, President of Howard Building Science; and Miguel Vega, Chief Revenue Officer of Nuestro Financial and Vice President of the Nashville Mortgage Bankers Association. The session highlighted the urgent need for solutions to ensure homeownership remains attainable despite increasing insurance challenges.
