Action Recap from

Charlotte's Redress Roundtable gathered with about 30 other Redress neighbors at Charlotte City Council to appeal for deeper investments in solving the city's housing shortage.

Ten Redress neighbors spoke directly to city leaders in support of a bond package that would invest \$100 million over two years in affordable housing. They further appealed to the city to push \$25 million of that bond towards homeownership programs for low-wealth people.



The Charlotte city council appears poised to pass a \$100 million Housing Trust Fund bond forward to a referendum in the November 2024 election. Redress neighbors will keep working to influence that funding to build maximum opportunity for the people of Charlotte!
