In January of 2023, two of The Redress Movement's researchers, Bo McMillan and Malik Jackson, headed off to Denver, CO to touch ground with Kevin Patterson, our Denver Field Organizer. While in Denver, they dived into archival documents that traced the history of segregation in Colorado to inform and research upcoming Denver field campaigns.

While in Denver, they submitted written testimony to the State Legislature. Using research they collected during the trip, they wrote out their support for proposed legislation that would curb conflicts of interest in Colorado's metro districts.
